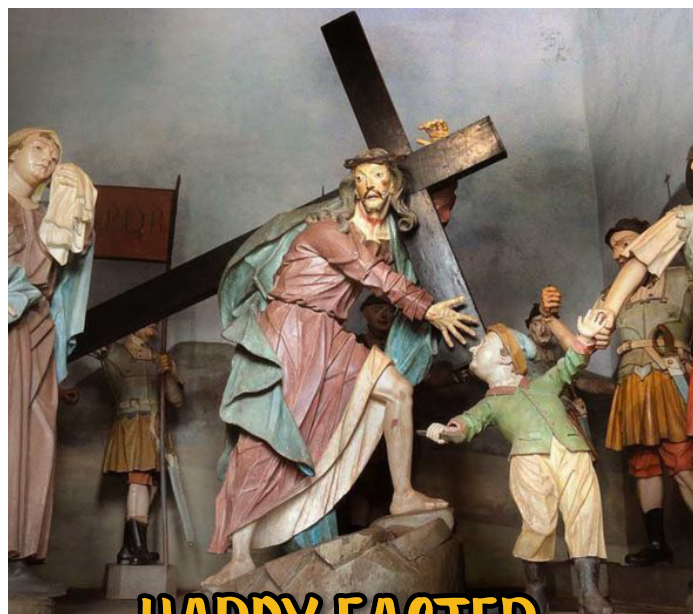

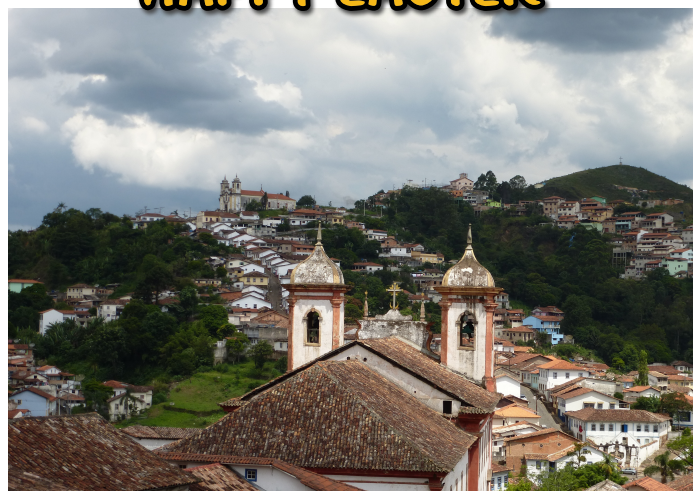
### WELCOME TO MY THIRD BRADESTINO® NEWSLETTER
